Good Spirit During Times of Need

During the snowy period we asked faith communities, across Surrey County, to let us know what they had been doing to help the wider community. We received some enlightening responses, which we will share with you here. We would still love to hear from your faith community if there are activities that you have done for the wider community, not only during the snowy period, but at any time of the year. We hope that you will enjoy these accounts and that they will be an inspiration for others to also take action in the future.



The Whole Community Coming Together in Chiddingfold

The Chiddingfold Churches (St Mary's Parish Church, St Teresa's RC Church, Baptist Church) have a Good Neighbours Scheme which aims to provide a warm and friendly welcome to all new residents to the village and to be able to offer help in times of need. At our recent AGM we made an Extreme Weather Plan which has been put to use in the recent bad weather.

Chiddingfold is a large village geographically, with a well-populated centre and a sprawling outer section where houses can be a quarter of a mile apart. There are many elderly and vulnerable people living alone. Our 100 good neighbours cover the entire village which has a population of around 3,000.

The village is divided into twelve geographical areas each with a coordinator. When the snow and ice arrived and many of our roads were impassable the coordinators contacted every Good Neighbour to ask them to check that everyone in their area was managing.

The Parish Council had notified us that local people with 4-wheel drive cars were willing to deliver supplies of medicine or food to those in need. Good Neighbours delivered milk and bread to those unable to venture out. In some cases professional Carers' were unable to get in so practical help was needed. Other villagers phoned to offer help. One resident drove a neighbour to Hospital for a kidney dialysis when the hospital transport failed to arrive. In many cases a reassuring phone call was all that was needed.

The Churches bi-annual Welcome Lunch, free to all new residents to the village, was due to take place on Sunday 5th December. As the weather worsened the possibility of cancellation threatened. It was decided that the event would go ahead and with the practical support of the whole community: the three churches, Parish Council, and the Village Hall Committee a very happy and successful event was enjoyed by over 120 people. More than twenty representatives of village organisation's were present to show all that the village has to offer. The project was financed by proceeds made from our three churches coffee bar which is a wonderful way to offer friendship and hospitality to our new residents. ♻️

Rector's Modest Proposal Nets Over £4,000

Reverend John Fellows, the Rector of Compton with Shackelford and Peper Harow, wrote to a number of his congregation who received the Winter Heating Allowance. Revd Fellows said, much as the Allowance was welcome, if he were honest he didn't really need it. So, by way of a modest proposal, he invited people to join him in sending a proportion of the allowance, to Crisis at Christmas. This would be a way of comfortable England making a contribution to the needs of uncomfortable England.

The response was extremely positive and over £4,000 was sent to the charity. In addition, a number of people said that they already gave their allowance away, while almost everybody commented on the simplicity and ingenuity of this way of raising money for a good cause. ☸

A Brief Insight into

Elmbridge Multifaith Forum

Elmbridge Multifaith Forum (EMF) was formed in 2004. EMF is very active within the Borough of Elmbridge and aims to promote inter-faith / multi-faith dialogue and communication amongst many other things for people of all ages and backgrounds. EMF is keen to bring together local representatives of religious denominations in periodic meetings to discuss avenues of input into local civic activities. Its present membership includes a number of faiths and denominations, but there is always a need to enrich it with more members.

EMF also assists and collaborates with local voluntary organisations, providing manpower assistance, and, just as importantly, creating, on a multi-faith basis, a spiritual dimension to such activities within the Borough.

Importantly, EMF provides the Council of their local Borough with a readily available forum and contact point, wherever there is a need on a multi-faith basis for consultation or assistance. EMF has compiled a good data base of places of worship in and around the Borough of Elmbridge, and this database is available to the Statutory and Voluntary agencies.
